Concerns about security/vulnerabilities

Low security

Security vulnerabilities embedded and unnoticed

Concerns about quality

Poor quality

Difficulty with OSS "etiquette"

It's hard to clean up the code before release

Version compatibility is troublesome

Difficult to understand the licensing concept

Responsibilities of the product owner

Concerns about responsibility

No guarantee

Unclear responsibility for quality

Irresponsible

The government (the client) has a distorted understanding

Concerns about sustaining operations

Maintenance is very hard work

Difficult to maintain

Updates may be discontinued at any time

May have a short lifespan

Nothing will happen even if I publish it

It's hard to keep things lively

It's hard to gather collaborators and continue the project

Concerns felt by those who are involved in or want to be involved in the community
